



## **KS2: Moderator Led Assessment Networks**

## A series of three network events to support Year 6 teachers in making accurate assessments using the Teacher Assessment Frameworks.

These sessions will give teachers the opportunity to use exemplification and standardisation material to unpick the standard and apply this understanding to the assessment of their pupils' writing. They are also intended to support reflection about curriculum and pedagogy so that all children are enabled to achieve the standard. These events will be held in schools around the county to support development of a strong network of Year 6 teachers within each locality.

The sessions will take place face-to-face at a school venue local to you and hosted by school-based moderators, in their schools. All moderators have been trained by the Local Authority (LA) to lead these sessions, to ensure consistency of messages.

Key information will be disseminated to teachers over the three events, so it is vital that teachers attend all three dates.

At each network event, moderators will brief teachers on key messages; use standardisation activities to develop understanding of the standards and the threshold between them; and facilitate discussions between teachers about judgements made using their own evidence bases. Time will be available to reflect upon the implications for curriculum and pedagogy.

## The focus of the twilights will be:

Session 1 Updates to the teacher assessment guidance, exploration of the foundation skills and trajectory to WTS (Working Towards the Expected Standard), and reflecting on the curriculum opportunities and teaching approaches to help to secure the standard.	Session 2 Exploring the trajectory to EXS (Working at the Expected Standards), unpicking key statements, and reflecting on curriculum opportunities and teaching approaches to help to secure the standard.	Session 3 Exploring the trajectory to GDS (Working at Greater Depth), unpicking key statements, and reflecting on the curriculum opportunities and teaching approaches to help secure the standard.
Colleagues will need to bring an evidence base for two pupils who are on track to achieve WTS.	Colleagues will need to bring an evidence base for two pupils for writing who are on track to achieve EXS.	Colleagues will need to bring an evidence base for two pupils for writing: one who is on track to achieve, or has achieved EXS and a second who is on track to or has achieved GDS.

Fully funded for all maintained Norfolk schools and for academies who subscribe to Norfolk Assessment Monitoring Services. Academies who do not subscribe to Norfolk Statutory Assessment Monitoring Services are welcome to book places and will be charged £30 per delegate. Delegates must ensure they attend all three sessions over the course of the year. For some venues, places will be limited so early booking is advisable.
