- Build confidence in staff to be reflective and professionally curious
- Build emotional intelligence in staff

Bitesize Briefings

In February the members of the Accumulative Neglect Operational Oversight Forum (ANOOF) held a workshop to review the process for bringing cases. It was agreed that we need to be more proactive about the learning coming out of ANOOF and have committed to producing bitesize briefings on themes emerging. We are currently working on two briefings on patterns of disengagement and intergenerational neglect. Watch this space for signposting when they are published.

Adolescent Graded Care Profile

The trial of the Adolescent Graded Care Profile tool is taking place in the City and South localities currently and will last until Friday 23rd May 2025. The Neglect Ways of Working Group is monitoring use of the tool during the trial period and the organisational leads for the trial are available to answer any queries.

Following the trial period evaluation will take place, which is likely to include questionnaires and focus groups of those who have been involved in the trial. This evaluation will inform next steps.

As previously mentioned, further work around the tool is necessary; there is an intention to develop a version of the tool for use specifically with adolescents themselves and additional support materials for working with children with disabilities.

If the trial is successful then wider roll out of the tool across Norfolk is anticipated to happen in Summer/Autumn 2025.

Accumulative Neglect Operational Oversight Forum (ANOOF) Workshop Update

The ANOOF panel met in February to review the ANOOF meetings and develop a plan going forward. It has been agreed that it would be helpful to have themed ANOOF's with the panel members taking the lead in bringing cases forward, the following themes for the year are:-

30th April- Medical Neglect

12th June- Education

26th September- Mental Health

20th November- Early Years

So please if you have any cases that fit in with this theme that you would like to being to ANOOF we would love to hear from you, please let your organisation's panel member know or contact Lucy or Jen:

We have also updated the case selection paperwork making it easier to complete and we are developing 7-min briefings around the learning identified after each ANOOF that can be shared across the system to support our practice.

Neglect Strategy Implementation Group

This is a multi-agency group who are tasked with facilitating the roll out of the Neglect Strategy and ensuring that its policies are implemented. The Neglect Strategy Implementation Group (NSIG) is made up of representatives from across the safeguarding children partnership.

NSIG will be working on a report evaluating the impact of the strategy over the next six months and presenting this at the next NSCP Priority Review Workshop in 2025.
