MASTERING NUMBER AT RECEPTION AND KS1 WORK GROUP

New for 2026/27, alongside the well-regarded Mastering Number materials, the programme will be expanded to include pattern, shape, space and measure in Reception. In Key Stage 1, new materials will further develop spatial reasoning within the number curriculum.

For 2026/27 this Work Group is open to all schools including those that have previously engaged.

Participating teachers will attend face-to-face and online workshops throughout the year in which they will be provided with teaching materials. The programme aims to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense. Over time, children will develop fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number from Reception through to Year 1 and Year 2.

Places on this programme are extremely limited, so please ensure that you register by 30th June 2026, so that your application can be considered. It is fully funded by the Maths Hub so is free to participating schools.



MASTERING NUMBER (EMBEDDING THE IMPACT) COMMUNITY

This programme is open to schools who have previously engaged in Mastering Number at Reception and KS1 - all schools need to be participating in a Teaching for Mastery Work Group.

The programme supports maths leads with the continued implementation of Mastering Number at Reception and KS1 within their own schools, and includes Year 3 materials which can be used to support children as they progress into Key Stage 2.

SKTMs

Specialist Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics (SKTM) programmes are aimed at members of staff who would like to develop their Mathematical knowledge. Participants attend sessions led by local leads, contribute to an online community and complete school-based tasks.

RECEPTION TEACHERS

Open to all reception teachers, this programme will develop their subject and pedagogical knowledge of number, shape, space and pattern, ensuring that pupils have the best start in life.

We recommend that teachers attend with their TAs, where possible, to support collaborative planning and the strengthening of classroom practice.

TEACHING ASSISTANTS

Open to all primary teaching assistants who would like to develop their specialist knowledge.

Participants will enhance their maths subject knowledge, focusing on key concepts, representations and vocabulary to help pupils develop in number sense, additive and multiplicative reasoning, and fractions.
